GAME RECOVERY: On April 28th Chris Mosher received a call from Sgt. Fulton about a cow elk that had been hit on Highway 240 near Snively Rd. Chris took the call and deboned the elk on the spot with the help of Sgt. Fulton and club member Jason Niehbur. The elk was deboned in about 40 minutes and the 175 lbs. of meat were donated to the Union Gospel Mission in Pasco. A reminder that if you come across a fresh road kill game animal and are able, please claim the animal and notify Chris Mosher. Please stay with the animal while waiting for someone from RRGC game recovery to show up. If the animal is seriously injured, inform the local police authority so that they or WDFW can dispatch the animal. A permit must be obtained from WDFW online within 24 hours. If the animal is left on the side of the road, it will be claimed by others and the Union Gospel Mission will not reap the benefit of a resource. If you are able to assist in game recovery, please contact Chris Mosher at (509)302-5171.

SUMMER BOATING SAFETY: Members of the club need to remember boat ownership comes with inherent rules on the water and off. Now when you think of safety you automatically think life jackets and no drinking while driving. Well get out your checklists boys because it is the season to check your flares, fire extinguisher(s), PFD's, Bumpers etc. What you might not think about is that if you travel from one area of water to the next that you are required to decontaminate your boat and trailer. You should get into the habit of pulling that drain plug and making sure the entire bilge is cleaned out. The state's motto is CLEAN, DRAIN, DRY. You should clean your boat inside and out, including the trailer. Drain every conceivable space or item that can hold water. Dry completely before launching into another body of water. In Benton county they do voluntary inspections throughout the boating season. See when these are happening if you think you might be missing something and they will run through what you do and don't have on board. Also remember that if your small/large

boat has paddles or a motor you are required to stop at the mandatory watercraft checkpoints near the borders of the state. It doesn't matter if you only have a one-person pontoon or a kayak. Stop in and get it checked for those invasive species just like you have to do for the big boats. We want to make sure that our waters stay pristine. So, although you do not want to add another 20-30 minutes onto your trip, you might rethink it when you see lights and get that failure to stop citation....

NEW BUSINESS:

2. COLUMBIA PARK RRGC MEMORIAL SHELTER SIGN: The City of Kennewick Parks crew installed the new RRGC Memorial Shelter Sign on Friday May 17th, at Columbia Park next to the Waterfowl Habitat area. After two years of no sign being nearby or on the memorial shelter, we can now recognize some of those earlier contributions to the community from past and current members. We cannot hope to keep building and only looking forward if we never turn around and see where we've been. This was a collective agreement with the Kennewick parks department and the RRGC to reinstall a new sign on the shelter itself. Placing

it on posts back where it was would've left it susceptible to more vandalism in the future. Hopefully it will last 30-40 years without needing repair. These guys have been busy cleaning up quite the mess after winter but still found some time to get the new sign installed for us. When you see these guys in the parks, thank them for a job well done and their efforts.



3. ANNUAL CATFISH CHALLENGE:

President Richard Sharp announced that the Club Catfish Tournament (Bragging Rights Only) and Fish Fry will be held June 14th-15th. This tournament provides for a nice informal club get together for members. As well as collecting the Catfish for the annual Wild Game Dinner. This Challenge starts Friday and ends Saturday with the weigh in and fish fry being at Matt Cummings River House.

4. SALMON SUMMIT: On Tuesday April 23rd there were 7 schools and 17 classes that participated in the release of salmon into the Columbia River. Wednesday the 24th there were 4 schools and 19 classes that were present for the release. PNNL and NOAA placed PIT (Passive Integrative Transponder) tags in 425 fish the days of release. By April 30th 107 were detected downstream. Not all are counted as they pass due to antennae placement and the proximity of the fish. 31 salmon tagged were detected passing Bonneville Lock & Dam. As of May 14th, of those that were released 19 fish from the Salmon Summit have been detected passing the PIT antennae boats out in the salt water.
