

Wild Game Dinner Tickets Available



The next Hunter Education class will begin on Monday March 31, 2025. It will be an evening class held at Grigg's Department Store in Pasco. Registration will open on line approximately March 1.

Donations Received

A donation of \$2,500 was received from the Blue Mountain District of Garden Clubs in early December. The donation was identified for use for wildlife water systems (i.e. guzzlers). Thanks to Larry Martin for his efforts to monitor and maintain the guzzlers and to secure the confidence of the Garden Club members to provide financial support for the program.

Mr. Kim Sako of Kennewick donated more than 4,000 rounds of .22 caliber long rifle ammunition, some .38 Special handgun ammunition, and a Daisy Red Ryder carbine BB gun this month. The ammunition will be shared between our Hunter Education class field days at the range, Wild Game Dinner auction items, and monthly meeting raffle prizes. The BB gun will be included as one of the kids' prizes for youth attending the Wild Game Dinner.



Donations Given

Crystal Sylvia, a 4th grade teacher from Lewis and Clark Elementary School in Richland attended our November Board of Directors meeting. Ms. Sylvia is working with Jill Carter, a physical education instructor at Lewis and Clark Elementary, to introduce an archery program at the school similar to the program at Jason Lee Elementary. Ms. Sylvia was an instructor in the Jason Lee archery program when it was created and acknowledged RRGC's financial support to the program during its formation. Lewis and Clark has received a grant from the National Archery in the Schools Program (NASP) that includes 12 bows and \$1,200 for other equipment. The initial startup cost for the program is approximately \$2,400 so they are fund raising for \$1,200. The program will start as a physical education class with the hope that it will develop into an after school archery club similar to Jason Lee's. A motion was approved to donate \$600 to assist with startup of the archery program at Lewis and Clark Elementary.

The RRGC Hunter Education class graduates' pheasant hunt will be on February 22, 2025 at Limits Game Farm in Mesa. Several entities contribute to this event including the Ringold Chapter of Pheasants Forever, the Connell Gun Club, Limits Game Farm owned by RRGC member Dave Piovesan, and RRGC. The RRGC Board approved a donation of \$600 to Limits Game Farm to assist with the cost of the hunt.

Be Safe While Ice Fishing

Because our program topic this month is ice fishing, it is worthy of a word of caution that there are inherent risks associated with standing and fishing on inches of ice with very cold and deeper water below. Slipping and falling is a concern but the greatest threat is breaking through thin or rotten ice. New ice is usually stronger than old ice. Four inches of clear, newly formed ice may support one person on foot, while a foot or more of old, partially thawed ice may not.

Ice seldom freezes uniformly. It may be a foot thick in one location and only an inch or two just a few feet away. Ice formed over flowing water and currents is often dangerous. This is especially true near streams, bridges and culverts. Also, the ice on outside river bends is usually weaker due to the undermining effects of the faster current. The insulating effect of snow slows down the freezing process. The extra weight also reduces how much weight the ice sheet can support. Also, ice near shore can be weaker than ice that is farther out. Booming and cracking ice isn't necessarily dangerous. It only means that the ice is expanding and contracting as the temperature changes. Go fishing, have fun, but be safe!
