If you like to catch or eat whisker fish, this is a great opportunity to improve your knowledge about how to catch them. Habitat Committee Report

Larry Martin reported at the May 21 Board of Directors meeting that four guzzlers were inspected and cleaned the preceding week with one guzzler requiring minor repairs. He was contacted by a WDFW employee about a guzzler that needs repairs south of Wallula Junction. Larry plans to inspect the guzzler soon.

Wood Duck Nest Boxes - Dale Schielke

Some of the RRGC wood duck boxes are being checked for nesting hens that can be captured and banded. John Merk and volunteers checked 195 nest boxes in April and May of which 77 boxes were used by wood ducks. They were able to capture and install 25 new bands on hens; 14 hens were recaptured having been banded in previous years and returned to the same boxes. Dale Schielke and volunteers checked 245 nest boxes in April and May of which 101 boxes were used by wood ducks. They were able to capture and install 27 new bands on hens; 6 hens were recaptured having been banded in previous years and returned to the same boxes.

We are sorry to report that our ability to live stream from in-box cameras was not possible this year due to software changes in YouTube that clashed with our encoder hardware. We have been testing a new encoder but so far because it is not plug-and-play, we have not been able to get it to work either. We will continue to explore other options.
