

The next Hunter Education class begins on Monday March 31, 2025. It will be an evening class held at Grigg's Department Store in Pasco from 6:00pm to 9:00pm. On line registration is open on the WDFW web site and at least eighteen persons have already registered for the class.

Thank You's Received

Thank you letters were received this month from RRGC Use of Funds donation recipients Friends of the Mid-Columbia River Wildlife Refuges, USA Shooting, and the NRA Foundation. The donation to FMCRWR helps sustain the environmental education program at McNary NWR. The donation to USA Shooting helps fund preparation of the USA teams

for the 2028 Olympic and Paralympic Games in Los Angeles. USA Olympic teams are 100% funded by private donations. The NRA Foundation letter states "Your support is instrumental in advancing our mission to promote firearms education, safety, and training programs across the country and to enable us to continue efforts to preserve our shooting sports heritage, support youth programs, and ensure that the principles of responsible gun ownership are passed down to future generations." Wood Duck Nest Box Maintenance

Dale Schielke, John Merk, and their helpers have nearly completed the annual nest box cleaning and documentation of the 2024 nesting season use. As of last week 566 existing boxes have been checked and 26 new boxes installed, some of which are replacements of old worn-out boxes. Of the checked boxes, 252 were used by wood ducks, with 145 boxes hatching out 1620 ducklings. Two boxes were found with honeybees that have since been transferred to a beekeeper. We also had 78 boxes that were used by screech owls, plus 2 boxes with Saw Whet Owls. During these spring checks we recaptured 10 Screech Owls that were previously banded and captured 6 Screech Owls plus 2 Saw Whet Owls that we banded. We hope to finish the remaining ~60 boxes on the Yakima River by boat before the first of April. Dale and John are scheduled for a display at Libby Middle School STEM Day in mid-April. Banding checks will start in some of the boxes in late April or early May. Guzzler Maintenance

March was a very busy month for guzzler work. On March 6 a team comprised of Larry Martin, Robert Gerhard, Bill Watson, and Wade Conant repaired Guzzler 305 near the intersection of SR 397 and Owens Road south of Kennewick. On March 14 Rex Sherburn of Pheasants Forever and Larry Martin looked for and found a way to get repair materials and equipment to Guzzler 220 which is located in the Pepiot and Blanton roads area in Franklin County. Work to relocate Guzzler 220 out of the tumbleweed infested area and install a new pair of rain catchment aprons is scheduled for March 28th. McKaden Manderbach of the Washington Department of Fish & Wildlife, Jerry Bloom, Dale Schielke & Larry Martin

replaced Guzzler 342 on March 18. The guzzler had been destroyed by fire. Guzzler 342 is located in far west Benton County, in the McKinley Springs & Farnum roads area.

Hunter Education Pheasant Hunt Recap by Ron Ruth

Twenty-eight Hunter Education course graduates participated in the 2025 HE pheasant hunt at Limits Game Farm near Mesa on February 22. Participants started their day shooting clay birds at the Connell Gun Club followed by a safety briefing at Limits. Hunters were split into two groups with the second group arriving at Limits about the time the first group concluded its hunt. While hunters of both groups were at Limits concurrently, Ron Ruth presented a "hunting clinic" and WDFW Enforcement Officer Tom Bolt addressed the group and answered questions. Lunch was provided after the clinic by Limits Game Farm and Pheasants Forever. Approximately 100 people enjoyed Tri-Tip, chicken, and the fixings. The second group of hunters hunted after lunch.

Hunters were paired with mentors and dog handlers and directed to the hunt locations. WDFW provided funds for 100 pheasants that were released for the hunt. All of the hunters got a shot at a bird and most (maybe 65% to 75%) harvested one or more birds.

Special thanks to the sponsors of this year's hunt: Ringold Pheasants Forever Chapter for purchasing and preparing the food; Connell Gun Club for providing the facilities and clay bird thrower; WDFW for providing the funds to purchase the birds and providing guns for those that didn't have one to hunt with; Tom Bolt, enforcement officer, for his presentation; Richland Rod and Gun Club for providing guns to those students that didn't have one, and a very nice monitory donation; Griggs Department Store in Pasco for the hunting ammunition; and 1st Hunt Foundation for their liability coverage. Special thanks to Ashley Reser for helping with the check-in process. Over 25 individuals volunteered this year as either mentors or dog handlers. Several PF volunteers helped with the setting up of the dining hall, did all the cooking, planted the pheasants, and showed the hunters how to clean birds. A very special thanks to Dave and Pam Piovesan of Limits Game Farm for all the help, coordination, use of facilities, and making sure this year's Hunter Education pheasant hunt was a success.
